At Mother Divine Public School, our approach to early childhood and primary education is aligned with the principles of the National Curriculum Framework (NCF). The NCF emphasizes that learning should not be limited to rote memorization, but should focus on experiential learning, creativity, and holistic growth.

1. No Rote Learning – More Exploration

Children learn best when they connect knowledge with real-life experiences. Instead of memorizing facts, they are encouraged to explore, question, and discover concepts through activities, stories, and hands-on tasks

2. Skill Development Beyond Academics

Education today goes beyond textbooks. Skills such as problem-solving, teamwork, communication, and empathy are nurtured through projects, role-plays, art, music, and collaborative tasks. Activities like the Student-Led Parent Conference (SLPC) empower children to take ownership of their learning and confidently showcase their progress

Remember: Grades may reflect a child's progress in one subject, but habits reflect the foundation of their whole life.

Together, as partners in education, we can help children grow into confident, empathetic, and skillful learners—prepared not just for academics, but for life.

3. Experiential Learning through Kitchen Garden

Our newly initiated Kitchen Garden allows children to plant seeds, care for plants, and watch them grow. These activities instill patience, responsibility, and a deeper appreciation for nature while connecting them to science and environmental care in a fun, practical way.

4. Assessments without Pressure

In line with the NCF, assessments are designed to track progress and growth, not to judge or label children. There are no exams in early years; instead, continuous observations and feedback help teachers and parents understand a child's strengths and areas for improvement.

Tips for Parents: Growing Minds, Not Just Grades

- Value Habits Over Marks – Encourage honesty, punctuality, kindness, and responsibility. These shape a child's character more than a score ever can.
- Appreciate Effort, Not Just Outcome – Praise your child's hard work, persistence, and creativity, even if the result isn't perfect.
- Make Learning Joyful – Link studies to daily life—measuring ingredients in the kitchen, gardening, or storytelling—to help children learn naturally.
- Model What You Teach – Children learn more from what they see than what they hear. Show them by example—read, stay curious, and practice discipline.
- Celebrate Individuality – Every child grows at their own pace. Avoid comparisons; instead, focus on their unique strengths and talents.
- Encourage Responsibility – Involve children in small household tasks. These teach accountability, patience, and teamwork.

Kartik said, "I will show you friends how to make spellings with these letters."



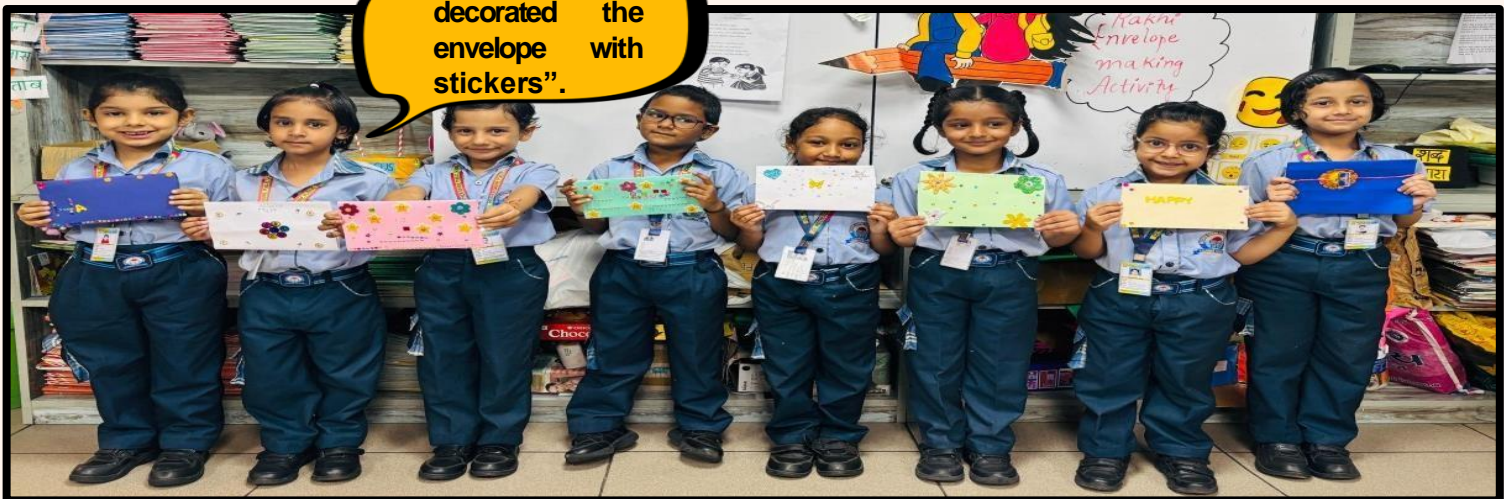
RAKSHA BANDHAN

INDEPENDENCE DAY

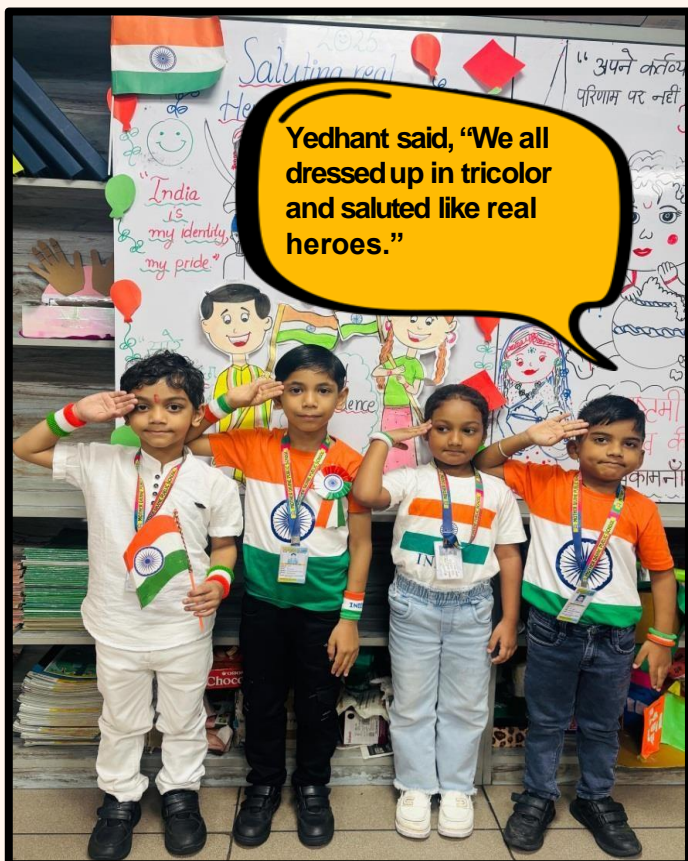
(14TH AUGUST 2025)

Namra said "My Tricolour flag looks so good."

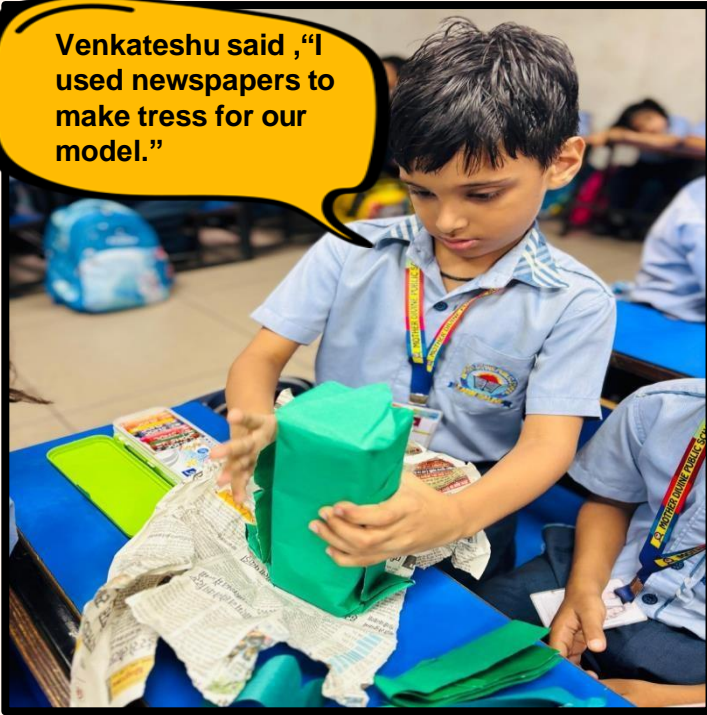

(4TH TO 18TH AUGUST 2025)

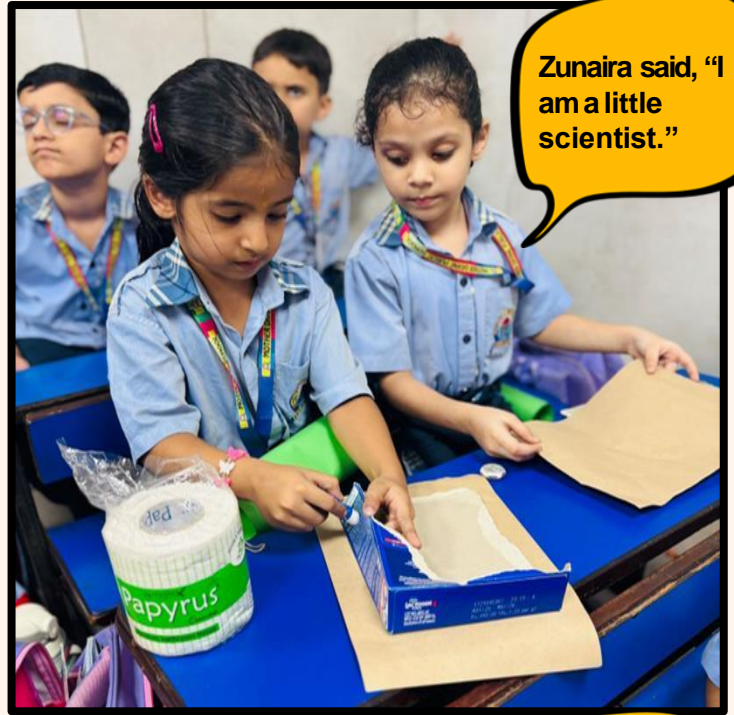
“Creativity is making the useless, useful again.”

Shiddat said, “My craft has buttons and colors.”



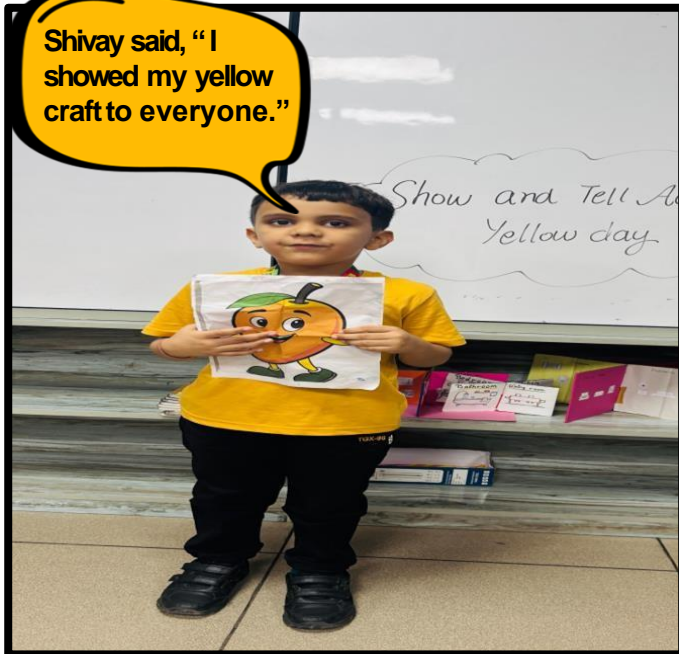
YELLOW COLOUR DAY

Saatvik said, “I liked the checkup because now I know how to take care of my teeth and keep them happy.”



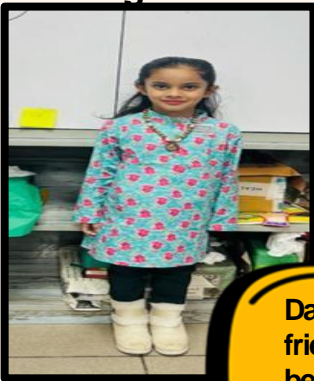
