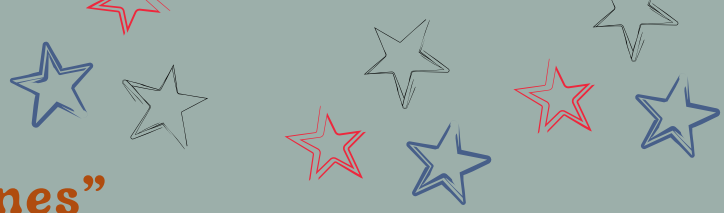

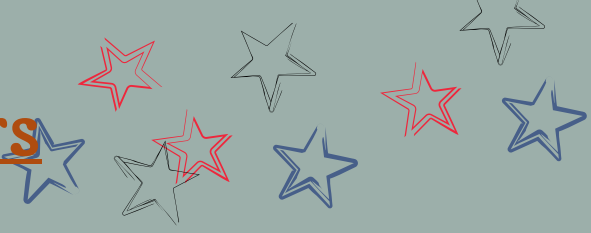
### *MY DHARMA MY LAGECY-TOPIC FOR GRAFFITI*

A special highlight of the day was her inspiring interaction with IVLP alumna Dr. Soumya Awasthi, making the experience even more memorable!

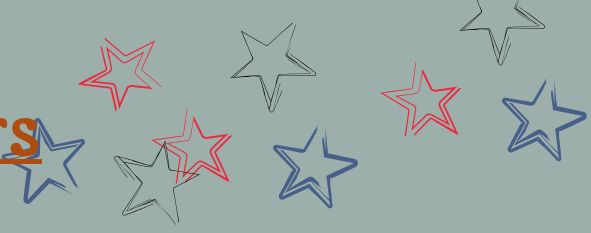

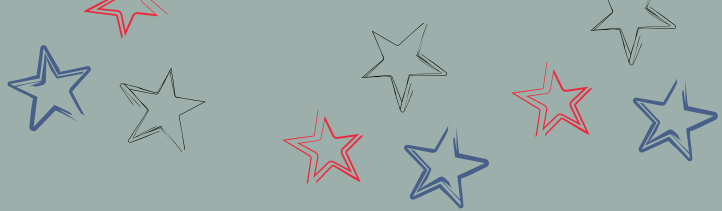
**Participants:** Students Grades XI-E and XII-E of MDPS**About the Session:**

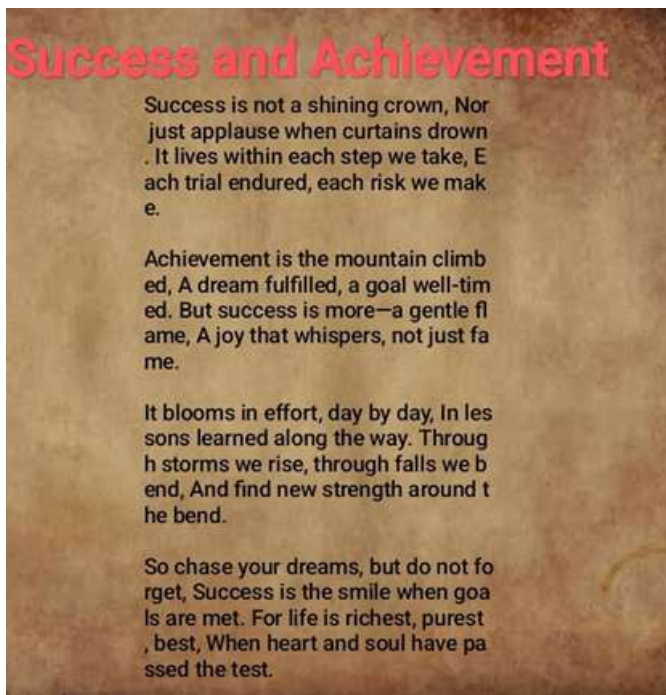
A ray of hope

### ***POEM ON Mental Health Matters***

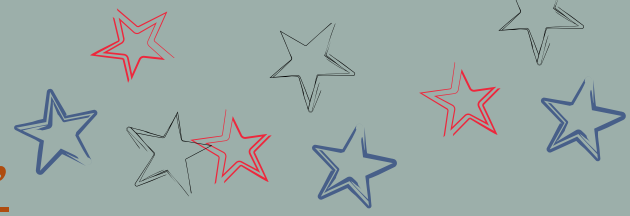
My mind is a storm,

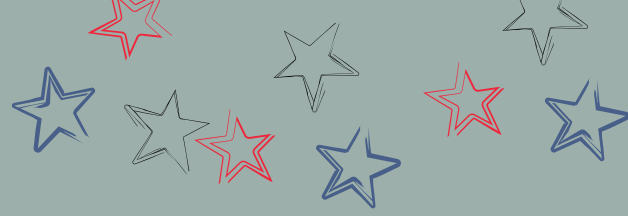

## Human Chain

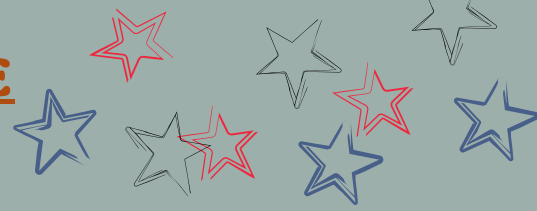

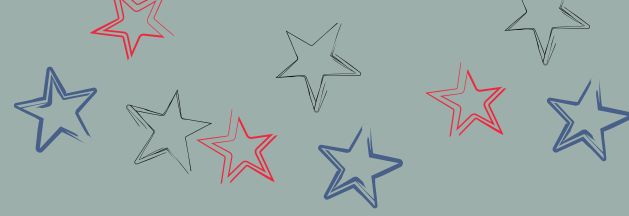

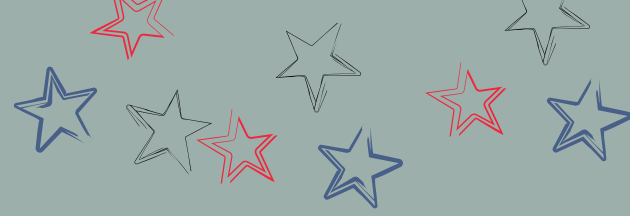
## INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION

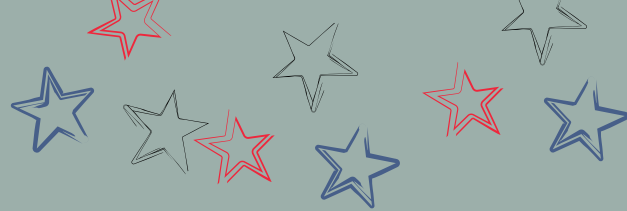
Mother Divine Public School celebrated Commerce Week 2025 with active participation from Grades XI & XII (Commerce & Humanities).

The three-day celebration nurtured creativity, critical thinking, public speaking, and collaboration, making learning both engaging and enriching.

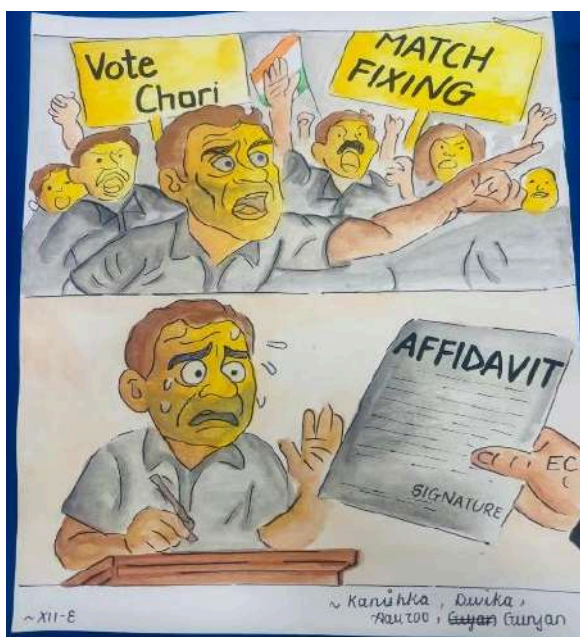




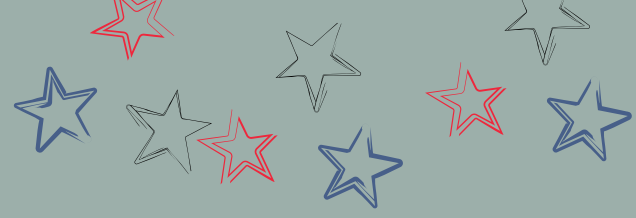

India is home to the only floating post office in the world! Located on Dal Lake in Kashmir, this post office sits on a houseboat. It serves the community while also being a tourist attraction.

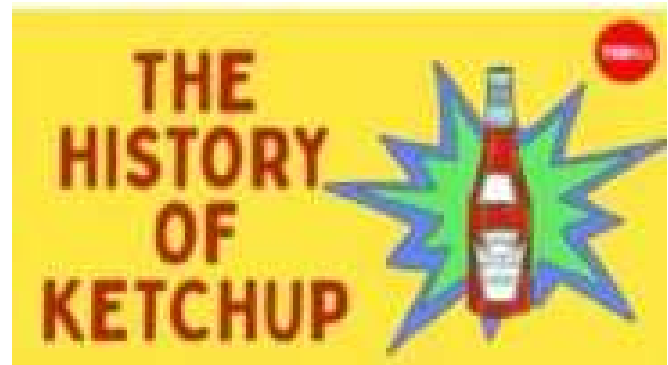

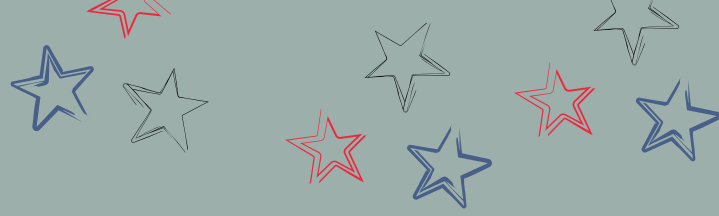
One of the most popular games of all time, not many people know that this household classic emerged from the nation of India, with a history dating back to the 2nd century BC.

### ***New OCI Rules Tighten Overseas Citizenship Regulations***

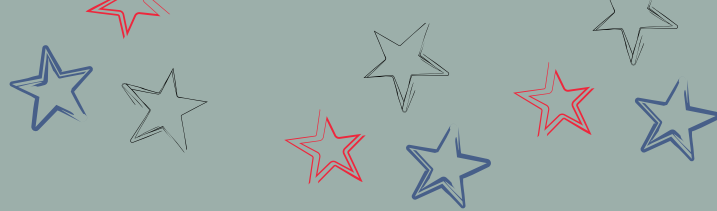

Recent research in Kerala's Western Ghats has led to the discovery of a new genus and two new species of freshwater crabs.

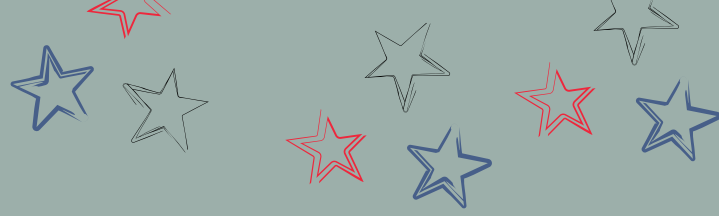

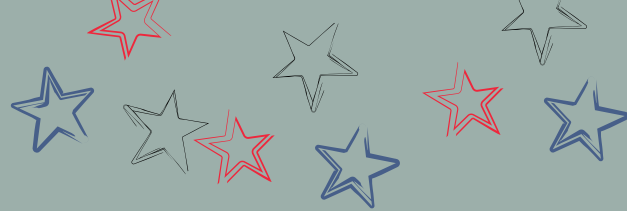
***Shipki-La Pass***

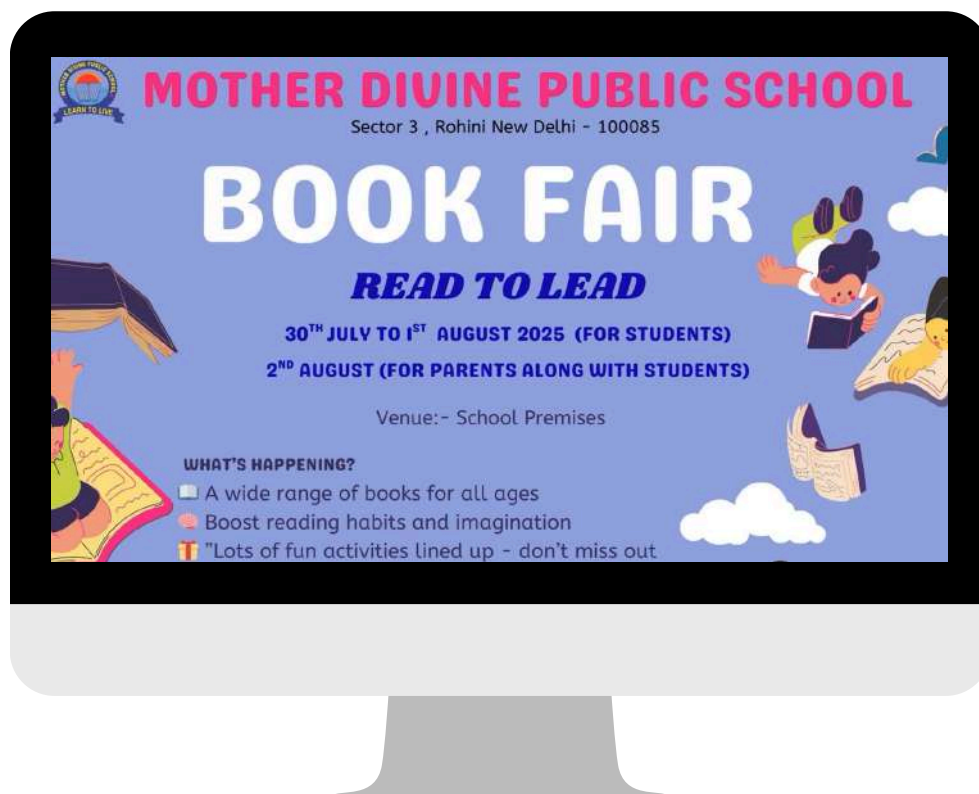
Mother Divine Public School proudly hosted a vibrant Book Fair from 30th July 2025, igniting a love for reading and creativity among students across all grades!
