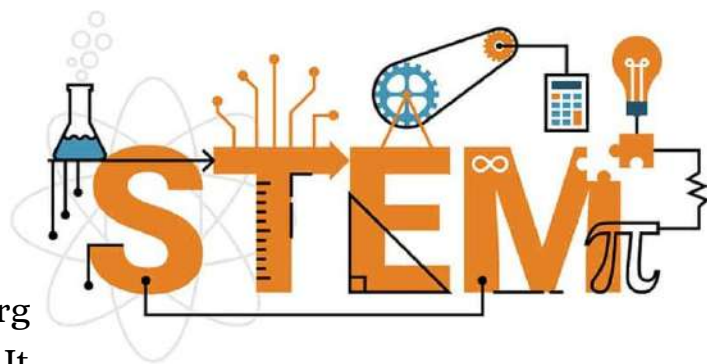
Overall, all these activities contributed to enriching the school experiences, promoting personal growth and developing valuable skills that benefited students immensely in many areas of life.

An enriching experience that beautifully bridged classroom learning with real-world industry exposure!





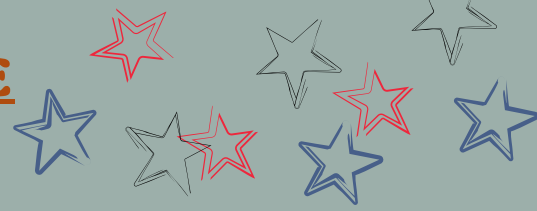
## Human Chain

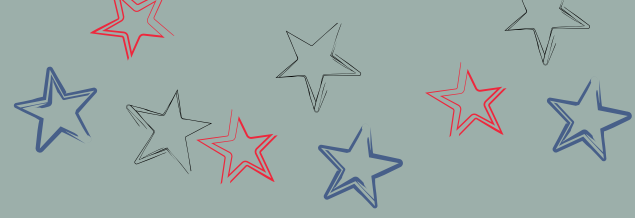

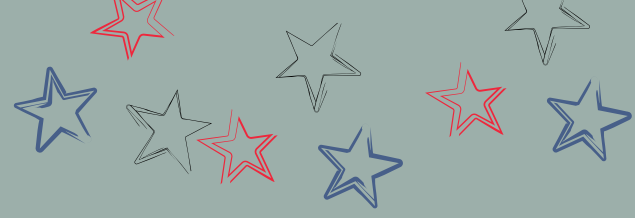
# FRESH START WITH POSITIVITY

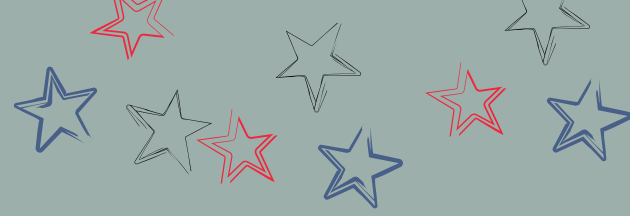
***“21st August, 2025 by Grade XII C”***

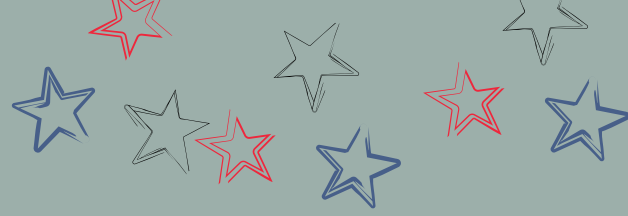


## ***"Independence Day Celebration "***

The three-day celebration nurtured creativity, critical thinking, public speaking, and collaboration, making learning both engaging and enriching.



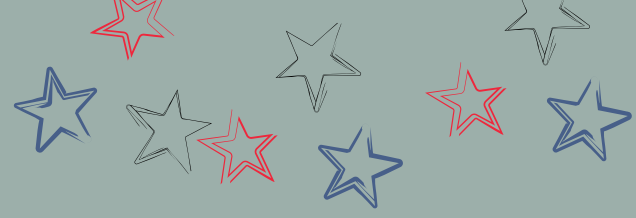

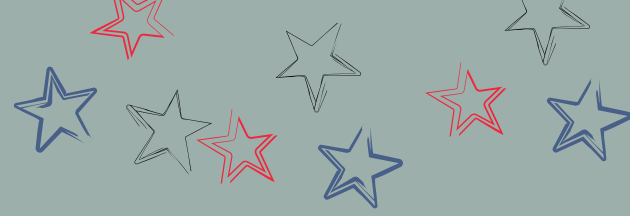

# FLAVOURS OF LANGUAGE, COLOURS OF EXPRESSION



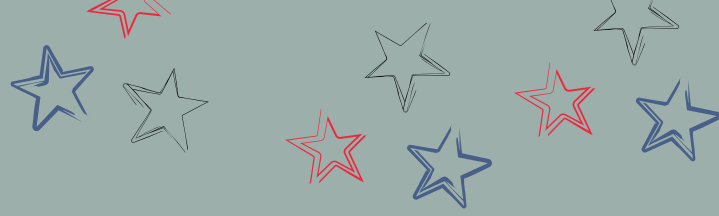

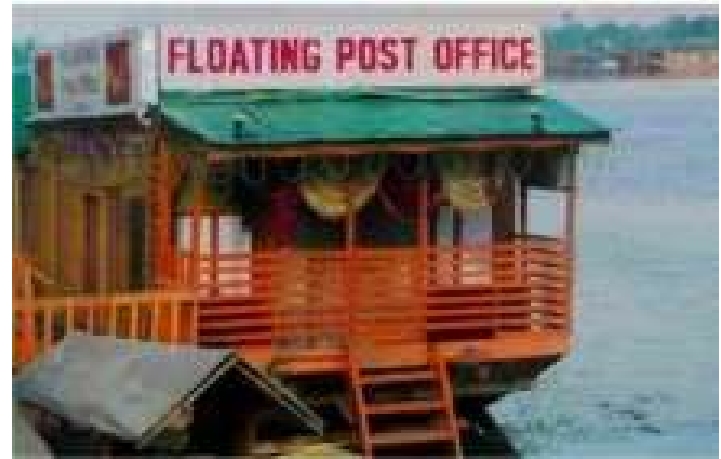
Overall, the English Week celebration was a resounding success. It provided a vibrant platform for students to nurture their linguistic prowess, communication skills, and literary creativity.

India is home to the only floating post office in the world! Located on Dal Lake in Kashmir, this post office sits on a houseboat. It serves the community while also being a tourist attraction.



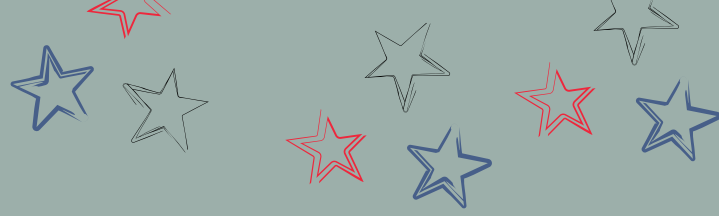

### ***New OCI Rules Tighten Overseas Citizenship Regulations***

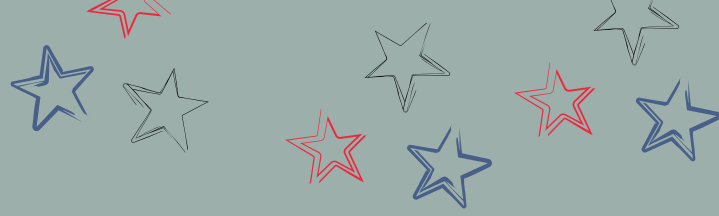

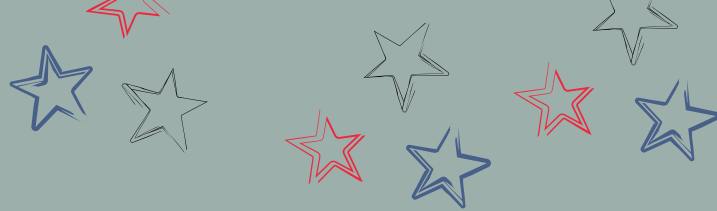

***India To Host 2030 Commonwealth Games***

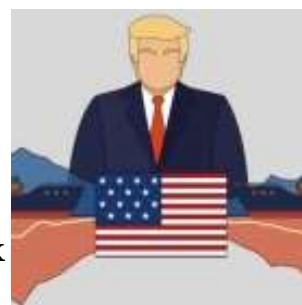

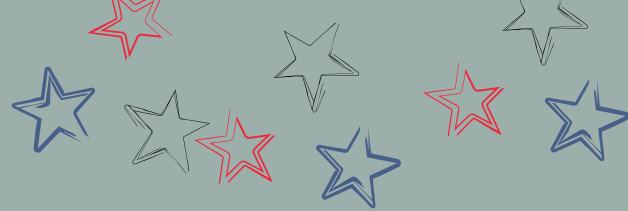
***Shipki-La Pass***

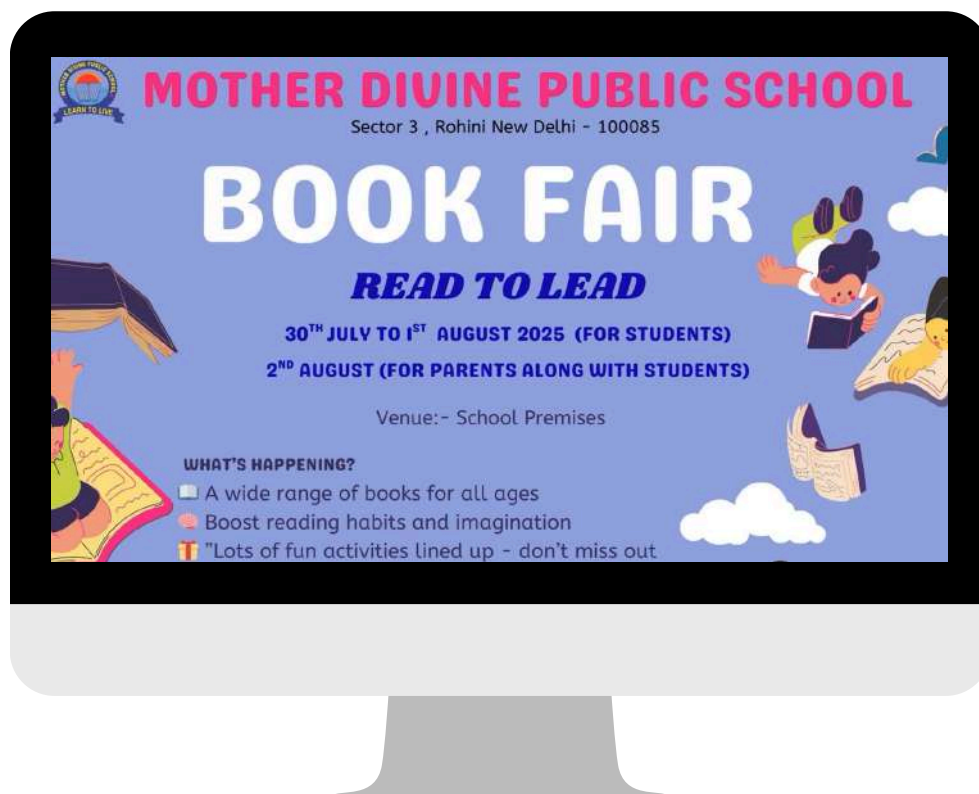
Mother Divine Public School proudly hosted a vibrant Book Fair from 30th July 2025, igniting a love for reading and creativity among students across all grades!

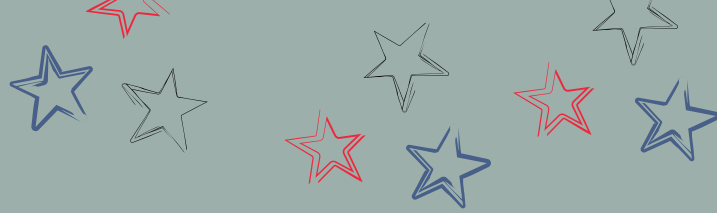

The Book Fair was more than an exhibition—it was a celebration of imagination, expression, and the timeless power of books.

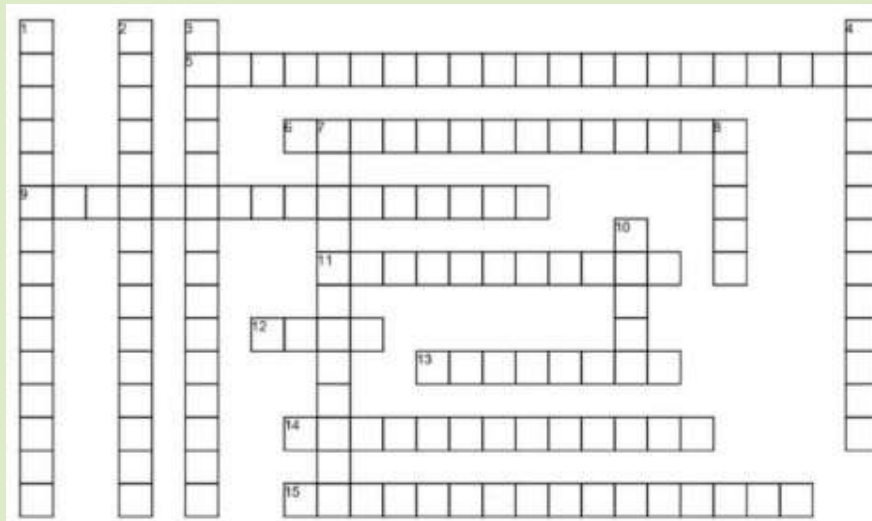

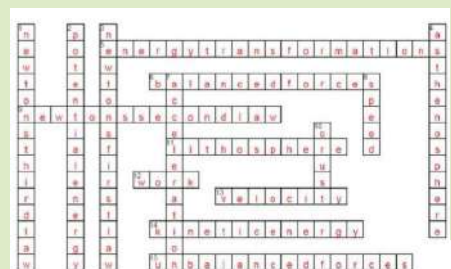

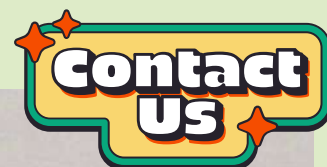
